Caliente Mountain Bike Trails—Crew Members

ACE is seeking to hire energetic, hard working, young adults interested in joining a trail construction crew to assist in building a network of new mountain bike trails in Barnes Canyon. Crew members will receive formal and on the job training from ACE staff regarding sustainable trail design and construction and will be an integral part of the construction of the remaining 19 miles of trails in Barnes Canyon. Crew members will learn to build and maintain trails in the ultimate classroom—Caliente's own backyard.



- Crews will be supervised by ACE crew leaders and work alongside other ACE staff and crews to complete the trails in the Barnes Canyon network.
- Crew members will work 40 hours per week in a typical 8 hour day or 10 hour day format, Monday-Friday.
- Crew members will receive a competitive hourly wage.
- Crew members will be required to adhere to ACE's strict no alcohol and drug in the workplace policy.
- Crew members will be selected using a competitive interview process and will be required to submit to, and pass a background check.
- The crew will work seasonally (August—May) with a short furlough in December.
